SUBJECT: Manager's Report

Ambulance responded to 32 emergency calls for the month of July. The Ambulance passed state inspection with no deficiencies found. Great Job, Robert Wood!!! The training topic for the month was Pediatrics by Kevin Curry.

Public Works has transported the Transfer Stations backhoe to Scarborough for repairs. The crew did some shoulder work on the Keating Road. Plow maintenance continues. Stumps have been removed from the Monument Park. There still needs to be more ground work done to complete the project.

Transfer Station brought in \$5,048.00 in revenue with \$2,014 coming from demo and \$1,890 from sales of small trash bags for the month of July. The backhoe needs some maintenance, issues are being addressed. Rain gutters were put on the office building. David said he is getting complaints from the public on the small and large bags ripping at the seams.

Fire Department responded to 6 calls for the month of July. A control burn was done for training purposes to brush pile at the Sandy Shores Campground with 13 members present. Engine 4 has maintenance issues with 2 broken springs on the rear axle and brakes. Engine 4 was taken to Copeland's Garage.

Animal Control Officer reports that during the month of July he responded to 5 dogs running at large complaints, two dog biting incidents and a complaint on feral cats.

Website Training was done this week with Melissa and I and we have started working on building the site. Linda attended customer service skills workshop held at Maine Municipal Association.

Sandy Shores Culvert Update: I have submitted material such as the DOT Bridge Reports on Sandy Shores to Bill Lane, in hopes to speed up the permitting process with the Army Corp of Engineers.
